New Year's Resolutions for You and Your Church

It's that time of year again. We're going to lose weight, exercise more, get out of debt, stick to a budget, stop smoking, save for the future, and spend more time with family. We make resolutions because we want to bring change to bear on our circumstances. We want to improve ourselves and our quality of life. And the top resolutions, for most people, tend to revolve around the same three poles: money, health and family.

But what would a set of New Year's resolutions look like for you and your church, your role as a leader, or simply as someone who wants to live a life of strategic Kingdom investment? And specifically, what if they came from the Bible?

Though many more could be added, here are 15 to consider:

- 1) **Pray more**. So he said to me, "This is the word of the Lord ... 'Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit,' says the Lord Almighty (Zechariah 4:6, NIV).
- 2) **Invest in your spiritual gift(s)** Do not neglect your gift, which was given you through a prophetic message when the body of elders laid their hands on you. Be diligent in these matters; give yourself wholly to them, so that everyone may see your progress (I Timothy 4:14-15, NIV).
- 3) **Get more intentional about evangelism** I have become all things to all men so that by all possible means I might save some (I Corinthians 9:22, NIV).
- 4) **Care for yourself spiritually** Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me (Philippians 3:12, NIV).
- 5) Make the tough decisions you know are best And now, compelled by the Spirit, I am going to Jerusalem, not knowing what will happen to me there. I only know that in every city the Holy Spirit warns me that prison and hardships are facing me. However, I consider my life worth nothing to me, if only I may finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me the task of testifying to the gospel of God's grace (Acts 20:22-24, NIV).
- 6) **Confront debilitating patterns of sin** Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us (Hebrews 12:1, NIV).
- 7) **Do the hard work needed to build community** If your brother sins against you, go and show him his fault, just between the two of you. If he listens to you, you have won your brother over (Matthew 18:15, NIV).
- 8) **Keep in touch with contemporary culture** From the tribe of Issachar, there were 200 leaders. ... All these men understood the signs of the times and knew the best course for Israel to take (I Chronicles 12:32, NLT).
- 9) Quit comparing yourself to other Christians, other leaders and other churches Turning his head, Peter noticed the disciple Jesus loved following right behind. When Peter noticed him, he asked Jesus, "Master, what's going to happen to him?" Jesus said, "If I want him to live until I come again, what's that to you? You follow me." That is how the rumor got out among the brothers that this disciple wouldn't die. But that is not what Jesus said. He simply said, "If I want him to live until I come again, what's that to you?" (John 21:20-23, Msg)
- 10) Read more Timothy, please come as soon as you can... When you come, be sure to ... bring my books... (II Timothy 4:9, 13, NLT)
- 11) **Prioritize your family** A leader must be well-thought-of, committed to his wife,... attentive to his own children and having their respect. For if someone is unable to handle his own affairs, how can he take care of God's church? (I Timothy 3:2-5, Msg)
- 12) **Refuse to use ministry to satisfy your personal ambition** Should you then seek great things for yourself? Seek them not (Jeremiah 45:5, NIV).
- 13) Love people, not just crowds If I speak with human eloquence and angelic ecstasy but don't love, I'm nothing but the creaking of a rusty gate. If I speak God's Word with power, revealing all his mysteries and making everything plain as day, and if I have faith that says to a mountain, "Jump," and it jumps, but I don't love, I'm nothing. If I give everything I own to the poor and even go to the stake to be burned as a martyr, but I don't love, I've gotten nowhere. So, no matter what I say, what I believe, and what I do, I'm bankrupt without love (I Corinthians 13:1-3, Msg).
- 14) Be more open to change See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? (Isaiah 43:19, NIV)
- 15) **Stay focused on the vision** They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to <u>prayer</u>. Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved (Acts 2:42-47, NIV).

January is National Glaucoma Awareness

Month. Currently, 2.7 million people in the United States over age 40 have glaucoma. The National Eye Institute projects this number will reach 4.2 million by 2030, a 58 percent increase.

Glaucoma is called "the sneak thief of sight" since there are no symptoms and once vision is lost, it's permanent. As much as 40% of vision can be lost without a person noticing.

What is Glaucoma?

Glaucoma is a group of eye diseases that gradually steal sight without warning. Although the most common forms primarily affect the middle-aged and the elderly, glaucoma can affect people of all ages.

Vision loss is caused by damage to the optic nerve. This nerve acts like an electric cable with over a million wires. It is responsible for carrying images from the eye to the brain.

There is no cure for glaucoma—yet. However, medication or surgery can slow or prevent further vision loss. Early detection is vital to stopping the progress of the disease.

Types of Glaucoma

There are two main types of glaucoma: primary open-angle glaucoma (POAG), and angle-closure glaucoma. These are marked by an increase of intraocular pressure (IOP), or pressure inside the eye. When optic nerve damage has occurred despite a normal IOP, this is called normal tension glaucoma. Secondary glaucoma refers to any case in which another disease causes or contributes to increased eye pressure, resulting in optic nerve damage and vision loss.

Facts and Statistics

Glaucoma is the second leading cause of blindness in the world, according to the World Health Organization. *Vision loss begins with peripheral or side vision, so if you have glaucoma, you may not notice anything until significant vision is lost. The best way to protect your sight from glaucoma is to get a comprehensive eye examination.* Then, if you have glaucoma, treatment can begin immediately.

Glaucoma is the leading cause of blindness among African-Americans. And among Hispanics in older age groups, the risk of glaucoma is nearly as high as that for African-Americans. Also, siblings of persons diagnosed with glaucoma have a significantly increased risk of having glaucoma.

Risk Factors

Those at higher risk include people of African, Asian, and Hispanic descent. Other high-risk groups include: people over 60, family members of those already diagnosed, diabetics, and people who are severely near-sighted. Regular eye exams are especially important for those at higher risk for glaucoma, and may help to prevent unnecessary vision loss.

School Bus Safety Tips That Could Help Save Your Child's Life



According to the NHTSA, riding in a school bus is the safest way for your child to travel to and from school. However, the "danger zone" when approaching or leaving the bus poses the greatest risk for children. They should be especially careful in the areas in front or on either side of the bus.

Children should also respect the bus driver and follow the rules while riding the bus, and stay quietly seated on the ride to school. Here are a few school bus safety tips you can teach your child if he or she will be riding the bus to school this year.

School Bus Safety Rule

- 1. Do not get on the bus until the driver says it is safe to do so.
- 2. Ask the driver to help if you drop something while getting on or off the bus.
- 3. Once on the school bus, go directly to your seat and sit down, facing the front of the bus.
- 4. When exiting the bus, look around for cars before walking away or crossing the street.
- 5. Do not wait at the bus stop alone.
- 6. Use the handrails when getting on and off the bus.
- 7. If you miss the bus, don't run after it!





MLK Holiday is January 20, 2014

Interesting Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Facts

- 1) His name was originally Michael, not Martin. His father was also Michael King, hence why Martin Luther King Jr. was originally named Michael King Jr. However, after a trip to Germany in 1931, Michael King Sr. changed his own name in homage to historic German theologian Martin Luther. Michael King Jr. was two years old at the time and King Sr. made the decision to change his son's name to Martin Luther as well.
- 2) At the age of 12, he seems to have tried to commit suicide. It was May of 1941 when his grand-mother passed away after a heart attack. At the time of this event, King Jr. was off disobeying his parents by going

to watch a parade when they told him not too. When he came home and learned his grandmother had died, he went upstairs and jumped from the second story window of his house.

- 3) On the day King was killed, he was out on the balcony for a smoke. While you'll be hard pressed to find a picture of him smoking, he smoked regularly, though had a habit of hiding this partially due to the stigma, particularly within the church at the time, but also because he didn't want his kids to take up smoking, and so didn't like pictures of himself doing it, nor did he like to smoke when they were around. According to Rev. Kyles, after King was shot and before taken away by the ambulance, he removed the pack of cigarettes from King's pocket and got rid of the cigarette butt, partially to attempt to hide the fact that King was smoking at the time he was shot.
- **4)** Martin Luther King Jr. was nearly assassinated a decade earlier than his ultimate death. While on a book tour, signing copies of his book Stride Toward Freedom, on September 20, 1958, King was approached by Izola Ware Curry who asked him if he was Martin Luther King Jr., which he of course replied affirmatively. When he said he was, she said "I've been looking for you for five years." She then pulled out a letter opener and stabbed him in the chest.

It took three full hours to remove the blade. The reason? The sharp point end of the blade was pressing against his aorta and the doctors had to be extremely careful while removing it because of this. The doctor, Dr. Maynard, told him after, "If you had sneezed during all those hours of waiting, your aorta would have been punctured and you would have drowned in your own blood."

- **5)** King Jr. skipped two grades in high school, 9th and 11th, and entered college (Moorehouse College) at the tender age of 15 in 1944. By 19, he received a bachelor's degree in sociology.
- 6) He almost didn't become a minister. After graduating from college, he still had serious doubts about Christianity and the Bible and told his father (who was a Baptist minister, as well as his grandfather) that he didn't want to be a minister and instead was considering becoming a doctor or a lawyer. He later decided that the Bible had "many profound truths which one cannot escape" and chose to become a minister, entering seminary at Crozer Theological Seminary in Pennsylvania. He graduated with his PhD at the age of 25.
- 7) Although King today is often remembered as being an amazing public speaker, he got a C in public speaking during his first year at seminary. His father noted that even before going to seminary, King Jr. was one of the best public speakers he'd seen. Whatever caused his professor to give him a C, by his final year, King had straight A's, was valedictorian of his class, and student body president.
- 8) His honeymoon was spent at a funeral parlor... not because someone died, simply because a friend owned the parlor and offered to let him use it for his honeymoon.
- 9) King is to date the youngest male to win a "Nobel Peace Prize," winning it in 1964 at the age of 35.
- **10)** King donated all of the \$54,123 (about \$400,000 today) he received for his Nobel Peace Prize to the Civil Rights Movement. During his acceptance speech, he stated "I believe that unarmed truth and unconditional love will have the final word in reality. This is why right temporarily defeated is stronger than evil triumphant."
- 11) King won a Grammy and was awarded a Congressional Gold Medal and a Medal of Freedom. How on Earth did he win a Grammy, you say? He won it in 1971 for Best Spoken Word Album for "Why I Oppose the War in Vietnam".
- 12) His house was once bombed. This was during the Montgomery Bus Boycott, which lasted a total of 385 days.
- **13)** His mother, Alberta Williams King, was also murdered. She was shot and killed while playing the organ at church in Atlanta in 1974 by a 23 year old man, Marcus Wayne Chenault, who believed "all Christians are my enemies".
- **14)** King Jr.'s autopsy revealed that stress had taken a major toll on his body. Despite being just 39 at the time of his death, one of the doctors noted that he had "the heart of a 60 year old".
- **15)** It wasn't until the year 2000 that all 50 states officially observed Martin Luther King Jr. Day. The holiday itself was originally signed into federal law by President Ronald Reagan in 1983, with the first MLK holiday on January 20, 1986.
- **16)** Today over 700 streets in the Unites States are named after Martin Luther King Jr., with one such street in almost every major city. This is not even counting the amazing number of buildings, schools, and the like named after him.

The following quote from the great Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on non-violent resistance: Non-violent resistance is not for cowards. It is not a quiet, passive acceptance of evil. One is passive and non-violent physically, but very active spiritually, always seeking ways to persuade the opponent of advantages to the way of love, cooperation, and peace.


10 Reasons to Bring Your Child to Sunday School
