

## **CELEBRATE BLACK HISTORY MONTH**

#### Black (African-American) History Month: February 2014

To commemorate and celebrate the contributions to our nation made by people of African descent, American historian Carter G. Woodson established Black History Week. The first celebration occurred on Feb. 12, 1926. For many years, the second week of February was set aside for this celebration to coincide with the birthdays of abolitionist/editor Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln. In 1976, as part of the nation's bicentennial, the week was expanded into Black History Month. Each year, U.S. presidents proclaim February as National African-American History Month.

#### DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY LIBRARIES

The Association for the Study of African American Life and History has selected *Civil Rights in America* to mark the 50th anniversary of the 1964 Civil Rights Act.

"The history of civil rights in the United States is largely the story of free people of color and then African Americans to define and enumerate what rights pertain to citizens in civil society. It has been the history of enlisting political parties to recognize the need for our governments, state and federal, to codify and protect those rights. Through the years, people of African descent have formed organizations and movements to promote equal rights. The Colored Convention Movement, the Afro-American League, the Niagara Movement, the National Council of Negro Women, and the Southern Christian Leadership Conference carried the banner of equality when allies were few. In the modern era, integrated organizations such as the

Advancement of Colored People, the National Urban League, and the Congress of Racial Equality fought for and protected equal rights. The names of America's greatest advocates of social justice—Frederick Douglass, W. E. B. Du Bois, Martin Luther King, Jr., and Fanny Lou Hamer — are associated with the struggle for civil rights."

Fannie Lou Hamer

- (born Fannie Lou Townsend; October 6, 1917 March 14, 1977)
- Was an American voting rights activist and civil rights leader.
- Was instrumental in organizing <u>Mississippi</u> <u>Freedom Summer</u> for the <u>Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee</u> (SNCC),
- and later became the Vice-Chair of the <u>Mississippi Freedom</u> <u>Democratic Party</u>, attending the <u>1964 Democratic National Convention</u> in <u>Atlantic City, New Jersey</u>, in that capacity.
- Her plain-spoken manner and fervent belief in the <u>Biblical</u> righteousness of her cause gained her a reputation as an electrifying speaker and constant activist of civil rights





## Joll of Chicken & Rice

This traditional West African dish is a favorite right here at home...it features chicken, rice and veggies all in one skillet, so clean-up is a breeze.

Prep: 15 min. Total:1 hr. 10 min. Serves: 4 Cook: 50 min. Stand: 5 min.


1 tablespoon vegetable oil 1 broiler-fryer chicken (about 3 pounds), cut up 1 large onion, chopped (about 1 cup) 2 cloves garlic, minced 4 plum tomatoes, cut up 1 cup **uncooked** regular long-grain white rice Few strands of saffron **or** 1/4 teaspoon ground turmeric 1/2 teaspoon crushed red pepper 1 can (10 1/2 ounces) Campbell's® Condensed Chicken Broth 1/2 cup water 1 cup coarsely chopped fresh baby spinach leaves

### How to Make It

1 Heat the oil in a 12-inch skillet over medium-high heat. Add the chicken and cook until well browned on all sides. Remove the chicken from the skillet. Pour off any fat.

2 Reduce the heat to medium. Add the onion and garlic and cook until the onion is tender, stirring occasionally. Add the tomatoes and cook for 2 minutes. Stir in the rice, saffron, red pepper, broth and water and heat to a boil. Return the chicken to the skillet. Reduce the heat to low. Cover and cook for 25 minutes or until the chicken is cooked through and the rice is tender.


