Children's Mental Health Fact Sheet

- 1 in 5 American children suffer from a diagnosable mental illness during a given year.
- The treatment success rate for children's mental health disorders is 80%.
- 25% of pediatric visits are related to mental health issues.
- 25% of all pediatric hospitalizations are related to mental health issues.
- Approximately 50% of students 14 and older living with a mental illness drop out of high school. This is the highest drop out rate of any disability group.
- In any given year only 20% of children with mental disorders are identified and receive mental health services
- 50% of children with mental health issues have parents with substance abuse problems.
- 508,000 kids in America between the ages of 12-17 drink alcohol.
- 640,000 kids in America between the ages of 12-17 use illicit drugs.
- In a national survey of 12-17 year old youth and their trauma experience, 39% reported witnessing violence, 17% reported physical assault, 8% reported lifetime prevalence of sexual abuse.
- Among a sample of youth in juvenile detention, 93% of males and 84% of females reported exposure
 to traumatic experience. 11% of males and 15% of females met criteria for post-traumatic stress
 disorder (PTSD) PTSD and other mental health challenges can impair a youth's capacity to reach age
 appropriate developmental
- Children and youth who experience trauma display increases in stress hormones comparable to those displayed in combat veterans.
- Suicide is the third leading cause of death of youth aged 15-24 in the nation
- 11% of high school children in South Carolina reported "attempting suicide", 9% of middle school children reported "trying to kill themselves"
- · Anxiety disorders are the most common mental disorders among children.
- The treatment success rate for children's mental health disorders is 80%. Children are best served by early intervention, which can prevent them from being placed in more costly forms of treatment later on.


