Enduring love

Remember what it was like when you first fell in love? Gazing endlessly into one another's eyes. Holding hands under the stars. But often the romance gets lost as married bliss becomes a monotonous repetition of the humdrum of daily existence. And looking back, you can't help but wonder, "Is this what love and families are all about?" The song that Solomon wrote, which you find in the Bible, speaks of a love that was fulfilling and enduring, not because problems didn't enter in to try to steal love away, but because a commitment had been made to make love work (Song of Solomon). Satan is working harder than ever to destroy our families through these conflicts. But God promises us that we can "submit therefore to God, resist the Devil and he will flee from you" (James 4:7). God requires that we exercise our authority over the enemy and be committed to the permanence of marriage and family (1 Corinthians 7:11). It is only through our commitment to God and one another that we can be over comers.

The family unit begins when "a man shall leave his father and his mother and shall cleave to his wife" (Genesis 2:24). This is a show of the man's commitment to his wife. Thus they become one flesh. How two people become one is a great mystery in life. And this mysterious union reflects the relationship between Christ and the church (Ephesians 5;32). When we are born again, we somehow inexplicably become one with Christ. And marriage helps us understand this mystical oneness. So when husbands are told to love their wives, they are told to do so in the same way that Jesus loves the church. Jesus loved us by giving His life for us (Ephesians 5:25). In the same way, the husband serves his wife by giving his life for her. This doesn't mean he becomes her servant,

jumping at her every beck and call. Rather, he serves her by loving her - encouraging her to become the best woman of God she can be. He loves her more than himself. He admires her talents and abilities and "praises her" (Proverbs 31:28). Not only does he tell her what a treasure she is, he tells other people what a wonderful wife he has. This creates an atmosphere of mutual respect. And what woman can resist a man who truly loves and cherishes her? Love encourages submission. "Christ is the head of every man, and the man is the head of a woman, and God is the head of Christ" (1 Corinthians 11:3). Note first in this scripture that the head of Christ is God. Jesus, while on this earth, willingly submitted to the Father. He said that he didn't come to earth to do His own will, but rather the will of His Father (John 6:38). The husband-wife relationship is compared in Scripture to the Father-Son relationship. "The man is the head of a woman and God is the head of Christ" (1 Corinthians 11:3). We know that Jesus and God the Father are equal. But the woman, like Christ, willingly submits herself to the husband, not because she is forced to, but because she chooses to, recognizing this is God's will for her life (Ephesians 5:22). The key is love.

What about the children? The relationship between the husband and wife sets the stage for how children will behave in a family. If the mother shows respect for her husband, the children will respect their father. If the husband reverences his wife, the children will honor their mother. Example is a great teacher. And teacher is the role that God gave us with our children. "And you shall teach them (the words of God) diligently to your sons and shall talk of them when you lie down and when you rise up" (Deuteronomy 6:7). The Bible says that children are a blessing from the Lord, that the man who has a lot of children is a happy man (<u>Psalm 127:5</u>). A father once said that he could think of nothing that would make him happier than to be surrounded by his family. This is a wonderful testimony to the beauty of a happy home. And it also points us to our heavenly Father's desire for us, His children; for the day is coming when we'll all gather around our Father's throne, and He'll be surrounded by His family. **Get the picture?**

For many families, there's just an ingrained pattern of non-communication when schedules differ and watching television absorbs the little time they might have together. But you can turn off the television and maybe shift schedules to make sure you all eat supper together. Play games, read aloud, bicycle, play sports, do something that knits you together. Pray together. Share your thoughts and feelings about God and what He's doing in you lives. Read and meditate on God's Word, applying its principles to your family life. Most important, whatever God shows you about your need to change your attitudes and habits, promise each other you'll make those changes. And whatever stands in the way, do not let it deprive you of the closest fellowship you can realize this side of heaven, the haven of your family. Let's Pray "Father, we ask forgiveness for not being the family that You have wanted us to be. Please give us the wisdom and the insight to make our house a home. Help us as a husband and wife and as parents to fulfill our godly responsibilities, to teach our children right from wrong and to lift up the name of Jesus. We commit each family member to You now, and ask for Your blessing to rest on our home. Guide us and keep us. May our family always glorify You. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen."

The History of Tommie's Closet

hen I was elected Miss South Carolina Baptist Youth for the Cooper River Baptist Association in 2011, I was tasked with finding a community outreach service project where I could make a difference in someone's life besides my own. I thought about it for a while and felt that visiting the nursing home was a good cause; however, that seemed too effortless, since that is always the safety net individual's use for many community projects. I sat down with my mom, and we came up with creating a free clothes closet. This idea came at a time when the economy was in distress and many individuals and families were having to make decisions or

juggle paychecks to pay bills, buy food or the basic necessities for daily living. I decided to create Tommie's Closet to help alleviate some of that daily stress by allowing individuals and families to come and shop for free. Tommie's Closet was created with no stipulations of financial status. The clothes closet is open to the rich as well as the less fortunate. My thoughts behind the no stipulation process was to eliminate a person or person's shame or embarrassment of being reduce to getting a handout, thus my motto came into existence, *"Giving a hand up, not a handout"*.

On the day of Tommie's Closet much pride and care is taken into the presentation of the items being presented; we want our guest to first feel not only welcomed, but feel like they walked into a no judgement zone. Two years ago Tommie's Closet incorporated serving food to whomever showed up on the day that Tommie's Closet was opened. My mother being the observant one, presented me with the question, "How do we know if some of our guests have a meal to go home to or even if they have a home?" Since 2013, Tommie's Closet prepares food at each event, again with no stipulations. Everyone is invited to enjoy a free meal and fellowship while enjoying their shopping experience. Since starting college, Tommie's Closet has been reduced to twice a year, to include a back to school event and a Christmas event which also includes a toy give away.

Last year 2014, Tommie's Closet was able to provide two families with turkeys, as well as the items to prepare a Christmas dinner. Since the creation of Tommie's Closet, we have helped almost 800 individuals and their families. I feel blessed to be a blessing to others. Growing up I watched my mother do selfless acts of kindness over and over again, and she always did it with gladness. I could not think of a better person to model myself after. Tommie's Closet is a success, because God planted a seed in me that blossomed into a garden; I thank God every day for allowing me to bless others.

Tommie is currently a sophomore at Benedict College, Columbia, majoring in Communication. Keep up the great work!!!


