Levery year these items pop up in lists of the Top Ten New Year's Resolutions. Do you plan on making resolutions for 2015? The first of the year is a great time to start fresh, set goals, and begin something new. It's the perfect time to evaluate our spiritual health and set some goals for growth.

Only the Holy Spirit has the power to transform us into the image of Christ (2 Cor 3:18). But God does expect our obedient and active cooperation (1 Cor 9:24-27). One way we can purposefully "train ourselves to be godly" (1 Tim 4:7-8) is through spiritual evaluation and goal-setting.

Resolutions and goals are often hard to keep. Statistics show that, at best, only 46% of New Year's resolutions are still kept six months into the year. People lose their resolve quickly because they set unattainable goals.

The following five tips will help us set personal discipleship goals that will keep us growing through the year:

- 1. Concentrate your efforts. Set just one, two, or three goals at a time. Don't spread yourself too thin.
- 2. Be realistic. Set goals that are attainable. If you don't read your Bible regularly now, don't set a goal to read the entire Bible in three months. Instead commit to read it 3 to 5 times per week.
- 3. Think concretely. For instance, I will read one Bible chapter and pray for 10 minutes five times a week.
- 4. **Include strategies.** Develop strategies designed to move you toward your goals. If one goal is to memorize Scripture, determine *how* you will do that. What verses you will memorize?
- 5. Create manageable steps. Break your overall goal into a series of smaller goals that will foster success.

How do we begin? First, take a serious look at your spiritual health. See Discipleship Evaluation below. This tool covers 17 different key discipleship areas. Your weakest areas can be great growth areas in 2015.

Next, set spiritual growth goals using the five tips above. Planning is not "unspiritual." Living a life that glorifies God will not happen by accident. <u>The "Spiritual Goals" worksheet</u> walks you through specific areas of discipleship such as time with God, ministry, service, and Christian education.

Most importantly, ask God to guide you as you evaluate your spiritual health and set goals for growth. He will bring the spiritual transformation as you strive to live a live that pleases Him.

Discipleship Self - evaluation

When you became a Christian you made a decision to follow Jesus, to be His disciple. So how are you doing? Use the checklist below to evaluate the quality of your "follow-ship." Rate each statement on a scale of 1 to 5. One means you are very weak in this area and five means you feel you are extremely strong in this area. After reading each statement and rating yourself, set some goals for improvement. Refer to this paper throughout the coming year and at the end of the year.

(JOSHUA'S MENTORING MINISTRY FOR GIRLS)



Jeannine English, AARP's 25th president, had a long career in the California state government, concluding with a 10-year run as executive director of an agency that reviews and evaluates state government programs and services.

She reminds us of one of the most important features of the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Free preventive care (such as screenings and immunizations) for Americans of all ages through both Medicare and most private insurance plans.

Under the ACA, Medicare now covers annual wellness visit and preventive care at no extra cost to you. This includes cancer, cholesterol and diabetes screenings, and immunizations.

The ACA also requires most private insurance plans to cover recommended preventive care without charge.

We have no way of knowing many mothers will not die of breast cancer because a free screening found it in time; how many fathers will live to see their grandchildren instead of dying of a heart attack, because a free screening discovered high blood pressure and further tests revealed coronary artery disease; or how many children will be spared pain and suffering because a free immunization prevented measles, hepatitis or some other serious disease.

But here are some numbers we do have:

> Under the ACA, 71 million Americans pay nothing out of pocket for preventive screenings, because their private insurance covers the tests.

> In 2013, an estimated 37.2 million people covered by Medicare received one or more preventive services at no cost to them beyond their monthly Medicare premium.

In plain English, the odds are strong that the Affordable Care Act will; in some way, provide significant benefits to most Americans. You owe it to yourselves, your families and your businesses to do all you can to learn about the ACA, find out what's in it that will help you, and make it work to your advantage.

Never pay for 411 again!



Three Free Alternatives to Pricey 411 Calls Submitted by Sis. Cindy Cato

Need to look up a phone number while you're out and about? Don't dial 411 -- unless you like paying upwards of a buck or more for the privilege.

Instead, add one of these free choices to your speed-dial:

Free 411 (800-373-3411) - If you don't mind listening to a 10-second ad first, Free 411 lives up to its name, giving you free business and residential listings (which can optionally be delivered via text message).

GOOG-411 (800-466-4411) - Google's 411 service is surprisingly ad-free, though it limits you to business listings. Like Free 411, it can automatically connect your call and/or send you the listing via SMS.

Live Search 411 (800-225-5411) -Microsoft's 411 service offers business listings, traffic and weather reports, movie show times, travel resources, and more. (Live Search also powers Microsoft's Tell me service.)

Standard phone and SMS rates apply, but otherwise these handy services cost nothing. If you typically rack up several bucks' worth of 411 charges on your monthly cell bill, you could save big over the course of a year.
