




Children's Church Director & Associate Director

MEMORIAL DAY REMEMBER AND HONOR

Many people visit cemeteries and memorials, particularly to honor those who have died in military service. Many volunteers place an American flag on each grave in <u>national</u> cemeteries.



Crock Pot Honey Garlic Chicken

Prep Time: 00:10
Cook Time: 4:00

Total Time: 4 hours 10 minutes

Ingredients

♦ 1 1/4 lb boneless chicken breast

1/2 cup steak sauce (ex: A1)

♦ 1/4 cup honey

◆ 1 tsp garlic powder

1/2 tsp hot pepper sauce

♦ Yield: Serves: 6

Instructions

Place chicken in crock pot.

 In a bowl, whisk together steak sauce, honey, garlic powder and hot pepper sauce.

Pour over chicken.

 Cover and cook on low for 6 hours or high for 4 hours.

 For the last 1/2 hour of cooking, remove chicken from pot and shred/cut into pieces. Place it back into the crock pot and mix well with sauce.

 Serve with rice, noodles or serve on a bun for a sandwich.

Notes

Your cooking time will vary due to your crock pot/slow cooker and size of your chicken breasts.
