He noted that first came her date of birth spoke the following date with tears, but he said what mattered most of all was the dash between those years. (1904 – 2003)

For that dash represented all the time that she spent alive on earth...And now only those who loved her know what that little line is worth.

For it matters not, how much we own, the cars...the house...the cash. What matters is how we live and love and how we spend our dash.



Reading the poem *"The Dash"* brought back memories. Pastor Grove preached about the dash at my mother's home-going celebration on Thursday, August 25, 2005. The subject was *"Living And Dying With Hope"* starting around the 13th verse of *1 Thessalonians 4*.

I've seen the dash on tombstones, headstones, and obituaries. Until that day, I have never given that little symbol a second thought. I didn't realize that something I thought of as *small and insignificant was so powerful*.

No matter, if we are on earth for one day or hundred years, that little dash represents our lives; how we lived; what we did with our God given time here on earth; what we did for GOD, family and others; what we contributed to this world and so much more!

From that very day in 2005, I never looked at the dash (-) the same.



So think about this long and hard... Are there things you'd like to change? For you never know how much time is left, that can still be rearranged.

If we could just slow down enough to consider what's true and real, and always try to understand the way other people feel.

And be less quick to anger, show appreciation more and love, the people in our lives like we've never loved before.

If we treat each other with respect, and more often wear a smile... remembering that this special dash might last but a little while.

So when your eulogy's being read with your life's actions to rehash...would you be proud of the things they say about how you spent your dash?

Q: "What is Fasting? Why should we fast and how often should someone fast?"


