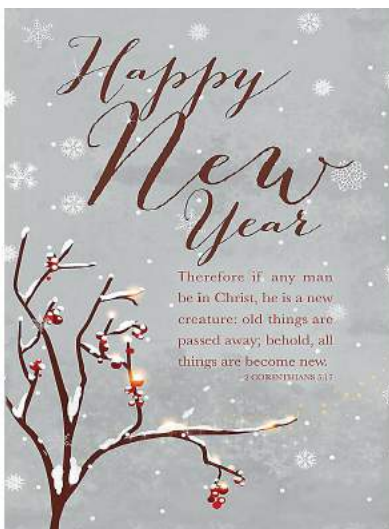
Message from Pastor

The History of Martin Luther King Jr. Day

Dr. King was an American clergyman and civil-rights leader. He became minister of the Dexter Ave. Baptist Church in Montgomery, Alabama in 1954. He led the black boycott of segregated city bus lines in 1956 and gained a major victory as a civil-rights leader when Montgomery buses began to operate on a desegregated basis.

King organized the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), which provided a base to pursue further civil-rights activities, in the South and later nationwide. His philosophy of nonviolent resistance resulted in his arrest on numerous occasions in the 1950s and 60s. His 1963 protest in Birmingham, Alabama earned him worldwide attention. He brought together more than 200,000 people on the March on Washington in August 1963 where he delivered his famous “**I Have a Dream**” speech. In 1964, at the age of 35, he was the youngest man and the third black man to be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

His interests widened from civil rights to include criticism of the Vietnam War and a deeper concern over poverty. His plans for a Poor People's March to Washington in 1968 were interrupted for a trip to Memphis, TN in support of striking sanitation workers. On April 4, 1968, he was shot and killed as he stood on the balcony of the Lorraine Motel.

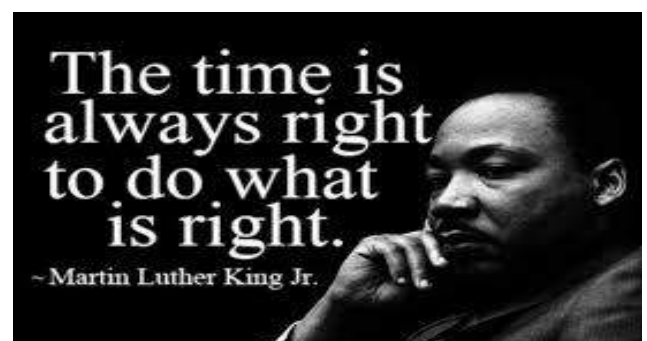
After his assassination, Mrs. Coretta Scott King devoted her energy and attention to developing programs and building the Atlanta-based Martin Luther King, Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social Change as a living memorial to her husband's life and dream. The King Center is the first institution built in memory of an African American leader and hosts over one million visitors a year. Mrs. King passed away on January 30, 2006.

As Dr. King's legacy continues, all four of his children have continued to be staunch advocates for civil rights.

Deacon Spotlight

Deacon Norman L. Vanderhorst Sr. is a native of Mt. Pleasant, S.C. He was raised in the Phillips Community and attended Charleston County public schools.

After graduating from Wando High School, Deacon Vanderhorst enlisted in the U.S. Army for 22 years, 10 months and 13 days as he would say. His military journey took him to places he thought he would have never seen growing up in the small Phillips community. He did tours in Japan, Korea, Gulf War, Desert Storm, 3 tours in Germany, Texas and Kentucky. He started out as an infantryman and decided to switch gears and become a 19K (Tanker). He has earned numerous awards for his dedication to his military service.



He retired from the military in 2005 and came back to the Phillips Community. He continued his contribution and joined in as an active member in the Phillips Community Association. Deacon Vanderhorst decided to return to the workforce after retirement from the military. He became employed by the U.S. State Department in 2007 and is currently working as a Passport Specialist which he enjoys.
