



A Splash of Inspiration

To: The Believer

"Forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead." Philippians 3:13 (NKJV)

To truly believe means to have faith that God is alive, is active, and is keenly interested in me today. "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that **He is** ..." Hebrews 11:6. Here it is written that **God is**, not that God was!

How Much Do Our Offerings Cost Us?

Our offerings to the Lord should include sacrifices of time, money and services that we think we can't really afford. We should be willing to offer these to God out of love and thankfulness.

The value of the gifts we bring to God will be determined by the extent to which God is real to us. When He is real to us, we will not offer Him things that do not cost us anything.

The Power of Praise



The Holy Bible says, "About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to

God ... Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake that the foundations of the prisons were shaken... all the prison doors flew open and everybody's chains came loose" (vv.25 -26).

Praise opens doors. Praise breaks chains. Any time you praise God in spite of your circumstances, the forces of heaven come to your aid. You say, "But sometimes I don't feel like praising God." The Psalmist wrote, "I will bless the Lord at all times" (Psalm 34:1).

Sometimes praise is an emotional response to God's goodness; other times it's an act of your will. Anybody can praise God in the good times. But when you have to rise above your feelings and your circumstances, that's when it really counts.

The battle of Jericho teaches us that sometimes you have to shout God's praise when:

1) You're up against a brick wall. 2) It feels like you're going in circles. 3) Your circumstances seem to mock you. 4) Your rational mind thinks, "This plan doesn't make any sense." 5) It's the last thing you feel like doing. But when you praise God anyway, you discover the truth of Nehemiah's words: "The joy of the Lord [the joy that comes from knowing He is present with you and has gone before you to work things out in your favor] is your strength" (Nehemiah 8:10).

When you're ruled by circumstances and emotions you live on a roller coaster. But when you give the Lord your circumstances and open your heart to praise Him, you move from weakness to strength.

"The Lord is my strength and shield. I trust Him with all my heart. He helps me, and my heart is filled with joy. I burst out in songs of thanksgiving." Psalm 28:7 (NLT)








This year we wanted to reach out to our younger ladies, 18 and up. These are the ones who will someday replace the older saints. Our mission is, "Reaching






eacon Eugene M. Wright was born in Charleston, South Carolina on May 8, 1944. He is the seventh of eleven children of the late Mr. Horace I. and Mrs. Hester (Gilliard) Wright. On November 21,

1965, he married Annette Sarah Kenlaw. Sis. Annette 🛭 Wright is the oldest of six children of the late Mr. James and Mrs. Mary Earlene Louise (Davis) Kenlaw.

Deacon Wright is a graduate of Bonds Wilson High, North Charleston, Class of 1961. He played safety on the BWHS Cobras football team. Deacon Wright also later played semi-pro football as a safety and tailback. However, that team folded after a few years.



He started working as an electrician's helper at the age of 16. He was employed at Carolina Ladder Company for two years and as a welder at Sturgis Company for two years. He later worked at the Charleston Naval Shipyard for 30 years, where he served four years as an apprentice painter of which 160 hours of classroom instruction consisting of Algebra, Physics, Geometry, English and Trade Theory were required. Deacon Wright conducted the first SSBN Submarine Refit in Kings Bay, Georgia, the first SSBN Submarine Refit period in Scotland and the first Extended Refit in Rota, Spain. He was also an Extended Refit Superintendent on the air carrier USS Kennedy, USS Forestall, and USS Saratoga. He traveled to different countries and states and had the challenging task of being responsible for cost, schedules, personnel safety and well-being of 200 to 450 personnel.

He continued his education at Trident Technical College enrolling in Practical Electricity, Industrial Electricity and Industrial Blue Print Reading, Industrial Trade Supervisory Training. In 1985, he was promoted to Code 970 Service Group Representative and in 1990, promoted to Code 970 Service Group Superintendent.

Deacon Wright received an outstanding performance award as Production Superintendent of Naval Shores Establishment. He also received a Presidential Achievement Award in 1993 from former President Bill Clinton.




After retiring from the Charleston Naval Shipyard in 1994, Deacon Wright kept on working. He worked as a security guard for Trident Security and a Maintenance II Tech with the North Charleston Housing

Authority for two years. He was also a Carpenter Trade Tech II at Charleston County Public Works Department for 18 months and later took a position as Superintendent Painter at The Citadel Military College of SC for 12 years.

n April of 1973, he was baptized in Joshua Baptist Church. In June of 1975, he was ordained as a Deacon at Joshua





He retired from his careers, but he didn't retire from serving GOD! Deacon Wright served as Co-Chairman of the Trustee Ministry under the Chairmanship of Deacon Jeffery Brown. After the passing of Deacon Jeffery Brown in

January of 1991, he was appointed Chairman of the Trustee Ministry. "To God be the glory," he still serves as Chairman of the Trustee Ministry, Advisor for the CAPPS Ministry, Sound/Video Ministry and IT Ministry.
