... your energy


- ... your abundance

Different Times—STILL TRUST HIM!!

Christian worship, as we all know it traditionally, has changed significantly because of the coronavirus pandemic.

"Things will never be the same," says Harry Moreaux in Naples, FL, one of nearly 400 church-goers who shared with NPR how the pandemic has changed their views of church life and also their expectations for worship in the months and years ahead.

He also writes that "I love my fellow brothers and sisters in God. I used to go to many church-related activities like Bible studies and men's fellowship. Now we barely communicate by text." After reading this, it was a reminder of how important it is to stay in touch with each other. Reach out with a call, card or text to someone. You never know how much of a blessing you can be to someone. It just may be the exact right time to brighten their day. As the song says, "He's an on time God." So, let God speak to your heart so you'll be right on time to help meet the need of someone else.

There was a survey which showed that in April, 90% of regular church goers in the US said their churches had closed their doors to combat the spread of the coronavirus, with the vast majority saying that worship services had moved entirely online. Social hours and church suppers are a thing of the past, at least for now.

The changes are not all negative though. Many of us have improved our efforts to stay in touch with our fellow brothers and sisters. We are communicating with some of them who we were not in touch with before. "This crisis has actually caused us to do a better job of picking up the phone and checking on each other. So there are some connections that are probably stronger now than they were before."

Make this a personal positive time—it's a good time to start working on strengthening our spiritual lives. "It's almost like God is sending everyone to their room for a time out." Use this as a time to focus on our relationship with God.

Pay Attention to Physical & Mental Health During COVID-19

Take care of your body – Get enough sleep; maintain a healthy diet; exercise; drink plenty of water; take medication as prescribed.

Limit your news intake — It's good to stay up to date on the latest COVID -19 information, but too much news can overload you with negative emotions and zap your energy.

Lower your stress — focusing on activities that are calming or bring you joy can lower your stress leve— taking a walk, sitting in the sun, reading, cooking, etc.

Connect with others – Although you should limit your physical contact with people outside your household, you can connect socially– attend on-line church service, make calls, zoom meetings, chat on social media.

🔽 lection day is Tuesday, November 3, 2020. South Carolina offers absentee ballots by mail to voters who will be unable to vote in person. All other voters are expected to vote in person. South Carolina does not

offer an early voting period. If you will be unable to vote in person on Election Day, you can request an absentee ballot by mail or by visiting your local election office. Important Information: Absentee ballots are mailed approximately 30 days before to each election. Friday before each election is the last day ballots can be mailed. All voted ballots must be received by the Board of Elections and Voter Registration Office no later than 7 pm on election day to be counted.

What to bring on Election Day— Photo ID - Acceptable forms include: SC driver's license or SC Department of Motor Vehicles ID Card; SC Concealed Weapons Permit; SC voter registration card with photo; US military ID; or US passport.

Voters without ID: You may show your non-photo voter registration card and vote a provisional ballot. However, for your vote to be counted, you must provide one of the photo IDs to the election commission before certification of the election (Thursday or Friday after the election).


