
Freestyle of Faith— A light can be switched on and off but the lifestyle of a Christian shouldn't do the same. Too often we find ourselves freestyling our Christian walk instead of lifestyling it. However, what we fail to realize is that there are no breaks from this Christian lifestyle. We don't take a hiatus from walking the straight and narrow. We don't clock out nor take vacations from doing God's will. Being a Christian is a 24/7 365 job. We are always on the clock. In public and in private, we are always on the clock. Our Christian lifestyle continues even when we think no one is looking.

Consistency of a Christian Lifestyle—Everyone has a way in which they live, a mental state in which they are constantly in and behaviors that guide their life. Point is, each and every one of us has a lifestyle. And although everyone's lifestyle is different, the one thing that remains the same is that all lifestyles are consistent. The way you lived yesterday will almost certainly be the way you live tomorrow. If you're a Christian, the way you live your life and the things you participate in stay consistent. 

The real joy the true Christmas brings.



For with hope and grace in which we are so faithfully bound, For it is the love of our Lord God in which we were found.


Brings to my remembrance of how Christmas began, A King was born to save the souls of all men.


