



By focusing on the enormity of the problems or the power of those in office, we lose sight of our sovereign God, who listens for our pleas that He may intervene.



10 Facts You Should Know About Martin Luther King Jr

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was one of the greatest civil rights

Few people have had as enormous an impact on life and society as Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. A Baptist minister inspired by other advocates of nonviolence, King encouraged oppressed and socially disadvantaged African Americans to fight for equality through peaceful protest. Although he was assassinated in April 1968, King helped to end legal segregation and was a key driving force behind the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965. Dr. King's life was one of hardship and struggle but also one of hope and building solidarity – the bonds he built and strides he helped make changed America and sent shockwaves around the world.

- King's birth name was Michael: The civil rights activist was born Michael King Jr on January 15, 1929, to parents Michael King Sr and Alberta Williams King. His father, a minister at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, visited Germany in 1934 and became inspired by the Protestant Reformation leader, Martin Luther. King Sr began calling himself and later, his son Martin Luther King.
- He was the youngest person at the time to receive a Nobel Peace Prize: When Martin Luther King Jr. received a Nobel Peace Prize for combating racial inequality through nonviolence, he was just 35 years old the youngest man at the time to do so. His prize included a check for \$54,123, which he donated to various organizations Congress on Racial Equality (CORE), the NAACP, National Council of Negro Women, Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) and others to aid in the progress of the civil rights movement.
- From 1957 to 1968, King traveled over 6 million miles and spoke over 2,500 times: The SCLC, an organization formed to aid the growing civil rights movement, elected King as its president in 1957; he led the group from its inception until he was murdered in 1968. Founded on Christian values, the SCLC sought to advance the cause of the civil rights movement, but in a peaceful way. Inspired by the teachings of Gandhi, King operated on Christian principles without violence. He traveled across the nation, visiting cities for speeches and protests. During these 11 years, King also wrote five books and published many articles.
- The civil rights leader was arrested 29 times and assaulted four times: Although King was admired by many, he was seen as a threat to American security by police officials. He went to jail nearly 30 times, arrested for acts of 'civil disobedience,' including the time he was jailed in Montgomery, Alabama, in 1956 for Driving five miles per hour over the speed limit. Even the FBI had concerns; paper trails show that the agency had continued efforts to thwart King's progress. After his "I Have a Dream" speech in 1963, the FBI intensified their investigation.
- King is the only non-president to have a national holiday in his name: In 1983, President Ronald Reagan signed a bill that would establish a nationally observed holiday in remembrance of King. He is the only non-president to have received such an honor. The holiday was first celebrated in 1986 on the third Monday in January, close to MLK's birthday on January 15. He is also the only non-president with a memorial located on the National Mall in Washington, DC.
- King was awarded 20 honorary degrees and was named 'Man of the Year' by Time magazine: During his lifetime, King received 20 honorary degrees from colleges and universities across the US and around the world. In 1963, he became the first African American to be named Time magazine's 'Man of the Year.' The tribute included a photograph on the cover plus a seven-page article, with several photos of the most memorable moments of his career such as meeting with President Lyndon B Johnson, and his 1963 arrest in Alabama.
- There are approximately 900 streets named after MLK in the US: There are approximately 900 streets named after King in the US. After his assassination in 1968, cities across the nation began naming and renaming streets in his honor; even Italy and Israel followed suit.
- King was nearly assassinated 10 years before his death: On September 20, 1958, King was in Harlem signing copies of his new book, Stride Toward Freedom, at a local department store, Blumstein's. A woman named Izola Ware Curry approached him, asking if he was Martin Luther King. When he replied yes, she said, "I've been looking for you for five years," and stuck a letter opener into his chest. The blade came close to penetrating his heart, nestled just along the side of his aorta. After several hours of surgery, King emerged alive; doctors later told him that "just one sneeze could have punctured the aorta" and killed him. King later issued a statement that he felt no anger or ill will towards the woman.
- His mother was also murdered by a gunman: On June 30, 1974, Alberta Williams King was shot by a maniacal gunman who claimed that Christians were his enemy and that he received "divine instructions" to kill King's father. However, because Alberta who played the organ on Sundays at Ebenezer Baptist Church was closer to the assailant, he opted to shoot her instead. The man was convicted, receiving the death penalty sentence, which was later changed to life in prison, partly because King's family did not believe in capital punishment.
- King's last public speech foreshadowed his death: On the night before his assassination, King traveled to Memphis to give a speech in support of the city's African American sanitation workers. At Mason Temple Church, he told the crowd, "Like anybody, I would like to live a long life. Longevity has its place. But I'm not concerned about that now... I've seen the Promised Land. I may not get there with you. But I want you to know tonight, that we, as a people, will get to the Promised Land. And I'm happy tonight. I'm not worried about anything. I'm not fearing any man. Mine eyes have seen the glory of the coming of the Lord."



The question could be asked, after the New Year's Eve Worship Service, the dropping of the BIG Ball in Times Square, and the Flip Flop Drop at Folly Beach--So Now What? Unfortunately, in this fallen world, many will continue doing what they've always done--choosing what pleases them.

At this Genesis of our lives, a new beginning, the Church (the people) must make individual, then corporate decisions about how we'll show appreciation to the Lord for allowing us to cross over the new threshold leading into 2022. Will we continue to drag reproaches and weights behind us, fueled by our faulty decision-making or stop the insanity and use a new approach,...ok, a pre-existing approach,...to follow the lead of the Ultimate Life Coach, the Holy Ghost?

"Fired Up and Ready to Go!!"; "Get Ready, Get Ready, Get Ready!!"; and "I Am SOMEBODY!!" are great motivating slogans. Perhaps as a precursor to them, we can shout I'm letting Go, and I'm Letting God!! No, the words don't rhyme but they've proven to be oh so powerful in action! What are your expectations of God the Father?—good health, food to eat, safety, protection for your family and you, some other great tangible blessings?

Before you carry your petition to the Father, make another list telling Him what Kingdom Work contributions you're going to do going forward, and ask Him to help you fulfill your it. You're talking to the Father, so keep it real. Don't make Him promises that you don't intend to make a genuine effort to keep.

Here's some inspiration! Remember the familiar story in Mark 6:45-52 about Jesus walking on the water? Let's pretend our promises are what He needed to walk on from the shore to the boat to keep afloat. Would your promises keep Him from sinking if He stepped on one of them for support? Keep in mind, He's the greatest gift that the Father has given us, (For God So Loved You and Me that He Gave His ONLY Begotten Son, JESUS, John 3:16).

The WORD declares that Holiness is the lifestyle God wants us to embrace (Be ye Holy, for I am Holy - 1 Peter 1:16). God didn't tell us to do it alone. Trust and Believe, and He'll show you how. If you have missed placed your card, you can get a replacement from DHEC. However, it will not have the location where you received your shots or the lot # of your shots which is needed when traveling, etc.


