


## Mother Helen Hill

- ◆ **Pandemic Committee** continues to keep current with the latest information and protocols from the Center for Disease Control (CDC) regarding COVID-19. As a result, the below changes are implemented immediately as a part of our progressive return to services as we once knew.
  - \* For fully vaccinated individuals, the wearing of mask or face coverings is optional. However, choir members will continue to wear face coverings.
  - \* While it is not mandatory, individuals who are unvaccinated are encouraged to wear a face covering for your protection and fellow congregants.
- ◆ **At-Home COVID-19 Tests** ~ The Federal government is allowing every household to order 8 additional free At-home COVID tests in preparation for the current surge and another likely Fall surge. If you are interested, you can order tests at [www.covid.gov/tests](https://www.covid.gov/tests). They are rapid antigen at-home tests, not PCR, can be taken anywhere, give results within 30 minutes (no lab drop-off required) and work whether or not you have COVID-19 symptoms or up to date on your COVID-19 vaccines.
- ◆ **Giving Envelopes** – When giving your gifts, clearly indicate on your envelope where you would like your giving to be allocated. Also, print your **FIRST** and **LAST** name on your envelope. **DO NOT WRITE: Doe Family or J. Doe or Doe.** We want to ensure that accurate records of your giving are maintained and cannot do so without your full name **CLEARLY WRITTEN**.
